THE EXPANSION OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH IN SOUTHERN MADAGASCAR

This past July during a Mission Education Trip to Madagascar we heard stories about the expansion of the Christian Faith in areas where Friends of Madagascar Mission (FOMM) supports programs. They are powerful stories because they tell how the Gospel of Jesus Christ brings hope and salvation to the people.



STORY 1: Translating the Bible into the Language of the People

Steve Lellelid has committed the past 16 years to translate the Bible into the Tandroy dialect. This group of people have not heard the Word of God because they did not have the Bible in their own language. Currently 20,000 Bibles and 82,000 hymnals have been printed at the Ebenezer Printing Company in Kerala, India at a cost of \$92,000.00 and are now being shipped to Madagascar for distribution among the Tandroy people. In addition, Steve and his wife, Tafisoa, have been teaching people how to read. Soon a program will began to distribute the Bibles and hymnals to the Tandroy people, and we will then hear stories of people coming to the Christian faith.

Story 2: 151 Baptized at the Village of Marolima

We have received marvelous stories of the work of FOMM supported evangelists where groups of 43, 120 and other numbers have been baptized into the Christian faith. While in Madagascar we heard of the village of Marolima where 151 (49 adults and 102 children) were baptized into the Christian Faith through the ministry of evangelist BENINDRAINY Albert, supported by New Life Lutheran Church in Duluth, Minnesota.

The reports we heard explained that the people are open to the Gospel and more evangelists are needed. For only \$700 a year (\$600 salary and \$100 for continuing education) an evangelist may be sponsored. We currently are supporting evangelists in 3 synods of the Malagasy Lutheran Church: 16 evangelists in the Betioky Synod, 21 evangelists in the Betroka Synod and 6 evangelists in the Ambovombe Androy Synod. Each of these synods have asked FOMM to support additional evangelists. In addition the Ft Dauphin Synod has submitted a proposal for support of evangelists in their synod. Please consider supporting an evangelist.

This growth in the Christian faith requires that the Malagasy Lutheran Church (FLM) establish a congregation to continue nurturing the faith of these new converts. The FLM has asked FOMM if we would assist these new congregations in providing corrugated steel for the roofs of these new churches. Currently we have requests from 13 new churches and FOMM is considering if we are able to provide these funds.

Story 3: Testimony of the Value of the Prison Ministry

FOMM supports prison ministry in 12 prisons. We visited 3 of these prisons in July. The theme of "We are prisoners, but we are free in Christ" was shared with us by the prisoners. One of the prisoners serving a 33 year sentence shared his testimony during a worship service: "We cannot manage to find the right words to express our thanks for your generosity. In a place that some call a second grave or hell, you (the Lutheran Church) come to us with words that give us hope spiritually, morally as well as physically. We hope you will be able to expand your ministry to more prisons in Madagascar. We need this ministry because you bring us hope, a purpose to life and the promise of a future with God. Thank you for your commitment to the prisoners in Madagascar."

We also experienced the excitement of the musical groups formed in each prison. FOMM provided funds to record their music. While they are not professional groups, the joy of singing about their freedom in Christ is evident. We call them the "Freedom Singers". A DVD of these groups will be given to everyone who makes a donation to the Prison Ministry Program. We hope, with an increase in gifts to FOMM, we will be able to expand this evangelism ministry to more prisons each year. The Madagascar Ministry of Justice continually asks us to begin this ministry in additional prisons. The cost for each prison per year averages \$3,000.00.

Story 4: Bringing Water to the Dry Soil to Grow Food

The Drip Irrigation Program is the newest FOMM mission project. The people of the south west part of Madagascar suffer from the lack of food, some estimate this happens four out of five years. FOMM has started two teaching centers, Ejeda Hospital and Manasoa Bible School, to teach people how to manage a drip irrigation system. This will provide enough quality food for a family even during sever periods of drought. After a person is trained they will be given a system. While we were not able to visit either of these sites, we visited the Patrakala Company in Antananarivo to see how the system works. We have hired this company to train the leaders of the program at Ejeda and Manasoa. We also purchase from them the drip irrigation kits that we use and give to the people.
