



### Cyclone, Locusts, Hunger- Describes the Crisis in Madagascar: How May I Help?

**Cyclone:** In February 2013 Madagascar experienced destruction from Cyclone Haruna, especially in S. W. Madagascar. The flooding from the cyclone destroyed the rice crops, homes churches and human life. In addition, the cyclone created ideal breeding conditions for a locust infestation.

**Locusts:** In March a locust infestation (picture above) threatened all replanted crops and livestock grazing lands. The United Nations has described the locust infestation in Biblical proportions. The locust plague is threatening the livelihoods of 13 million people who earn a living from agriculture.

**Hunger:** A farmer described his situation, "Cyclone Haruna destroyed my crops. I sold two of my cattle to purchase seeds to replant my crops. Now the locusts are destroying those plants and I have to sell my remaining cattle to provide food for my family." In this poor region of S. W. Madagascar where most of the people live on less than \$1.00 per day, 70% of the people are now suffering from a lack of enough food.

**How May I Help?** We welcome your financial gifts to provide food for people in this region of Madagascar. The funds will be distributed through the Ejeda Nutrition Program which is located in S. W. Madagascar at Ejeda Hospital.

We will visit the mission programs that FOMM supports: Prison Ministry (visiting several prisons), Evangelist\_Program (participate in the annual evangelist training conference sponsored by FOMM), and consulting with the personnel from Ejeda Hospital who supervise the Nutrition Program (where the results of Cyclone Haruna and the locust infestation are causing food shortages).

#### **PROJECT UPDATES**

#### **Prison Ministry**

Financial Need: \$30,000 a year (\$2,500 a month)

Each week the Prison Ministry Team visits five prisons (men, woman, and youth prisons). The theme of their ministry is from John 8:36 "If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." and from John 10:10 "The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have [it] more abundantly." The team leads worship, baptizes teaches confirmation classes, provides counseling and distributes Bibles, food and medicine.



Financial Need: \$8,400.00 a year (\$700.00 a month)

Ejeda Hospital is located in the midst of the destruction from Cyclone Haruna in February and the current locust infestation. The need for distribution of food to the hungry has risen dramatically as a result of these two natural disasters. Besides the \$700 a month FOMM seeks to provide for the Nutrition Program during normal times, FOMM is also receiving extra gifts to support the increased demand for food. These are very difficult times and our prayer is that congregations and individuals will provide extra support so the suffering people of Madagascar may have food.

#### **Evangelists**

Financial Need: \$600 per evangelist (\$50 a month)

Friends of Madagascar Mission (FOMM) currently provides financial support for 19 Malagasy evangelists. Our goal is to support 25 evangelists. An evangelist has a two year degree from a Bible School and is then assigned to move into a community without a church. They serve on the frontlines of reaching out to those who have not heard the message of God's love through Jesus Christ. They are supervised by neighboring pastors.

Each year in June, FOMM pays for an Evangelist Training Retreat. This year the FOMM mission trip participants will attend the training event. It will be a wonderful time to celebrate our mission and ministry together with the evangelists, supervising pastors and Malagasy Lutheran Church leaders.
