THE GIFT THAT CHANGED THE WORLD

EVANGELISM GIFTS: Sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ

1. EVANGELISTS: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations...baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20a)

FOMM is all about supporting evangelism through the Malagasy Lutheran Church! FOMM supports 76 evangelists who live in villages and travel throughout the surrounding area to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ. **During the months of July, August and September the evangelists baptized 1,208 children and 587 adults.** Now I would call that effective evangelism!

HOW TO SUPPORT AN EVANGEIST?

- 1) Cost: \$900.00 for salary, education and health care.
- 2) All sponsors receive the name of the evangelist you support
- 3) Receive 4 reports on their work each year and bio & photo

2. BIBLE SCHOOLS: "Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another." (Colossians 3:16)

FOMM supports three Bible Schools which train lay persons to become evangelists and congregational parish education leaders, called catechists. They study for 2 years with an extensive curriculum of studies: Old and New Testament, Church History, Lutheran Doctrine, Christian Ethics, Stewardship, Leadership Development, Malagasy Natural Religion, How to Witness and How to Teach Reading, a great preparation for their ministry. Upon graduation, they are assigned to live in a village and travel to surrounding villages.

HOW TO SUPPORT THE BIBLE SCHOOLS?

- 1) Cost: \$50.00 a month per student (Includes tuition, books, food and lodging, teacher salaries and maintenance of the school's facilities)
- 2) All donor designated gifts for the Bible School will receive update reports.

3. THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION "Christ gave gifts to the church in the form of people with specific roles: apostles, prophets, evangelists, and pastors and teachers. These roles are intended to equip God's people for ministry and to build up the body of Christ." (Ephesians 4:11)

The Malagasy Lutheran Church has a membership of 4 million plus members. There is a need to train enough pastors to meet the needs for a growing church. For some individuals the cost of tuition and board and room is more than they or their family can afford. FOMM currently supports 25 students.

A personal letter from a SALT Seminary student whom FOMM financially helped when she hemorrhaged at the delivery of her child, who died during delivery. "Dear FOMM, I know that you are a very kind organization. You take care of the life and education for many here at SALT Seminary. This means a lot to me. Since that moment in February, when you saved my life; I have never stopped thinking about you. Just as Jesus saved me on the cross, you saved me that day in February.

HOW TO SUPPORT A SEMINARY STUDENT?

- 1) Cost: Tuition: \$300 a year, living expenses: \$525.00 per year, and rent: \$280.00 a year or \$1.105.00 per year.
- 2) All sponsors will receive an update report on the seminary students.

4. PRISON MINISTRY "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." (Matthew 25:35-36)

There are 82 prisons in Madagascar and FOMM Supports mission and ministry in 32 prisons. The ministry is divided into two divisions: (A) <u>Spiritual:</u> Local congregations are trained to lead worship, teach confirmation, do counseling, provide Bibles and hymnals; and (B) <u>Humanitarian:</u> In the prisons they provide food, vocational training, providing legal assistance, clothing, medicine, assistance to return home after prison release; accounts of this divisions work will be shared under the HUMANITARIAN report on page 6.

HOW TO SUPPORT THE PRISON MINISTRY PROGRAM?

- 1) A gift of any size is very much appreciated which goes to the operating budget of the Prison Ministry.

THE GIFT THAT CHANGED THE WORLD

CHILDREN IN PERIL GIFTS: Reaching out to the children in need!

Jesus said: "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Matthew 19:14) Madagascar with a poor economy, has a vast number of children who are very vulnerable. We use the term "Children in Peril", which means they are in extreme danger. FOMM is developing many programs in this area of mission as we believe our actions are the hands of the Gospel of Jesus Christ reaching out to give life, hope and a future to them.

1. NOFY I ANDROY "See that you do not look down on one of these little ones, because I tell you that in heaven their angels always see the face of my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 18:10)

This program helps girls who are culturally vulnerable to sexual exploitation. It has grown beyond expectations as parents are so appreciative of helping to protect and teach the girls that they may have a great future upon receiving an education, a profession and a future full of hope! The program is growing rapidly at 8 sites and nearly 700 student enrolled.

HOW TO SUPPORT A NOFY I ANDROY STUDENT?

- 1) Cost per year: Tuition is \$200.00 a year
- 2) All sponsors will receive a photo and bio of a girl, plus two update letters a year from the student.

2. DR. JOHN DYRNES SCHOOL "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." (Proverbs 22:6)

Since FOMM began supporting the school, the enrollment has grown from 88 students to 600 students. It

has also introduced the Nofy i Androy program which includes nearly 100 girls attending the school. It is a school begun many years ago by a missionary doctor who rescued many children from death due to culture traditions. As the children became of school age he began this school. Because of FOMM's support today, it has saved many children from a life of poverty by



providing a quality education. The school has begun to distinguish itself as a school where all the children pass the government required advancement tests.

HOW TO SUPPORT A DR. JOHN DYRNES SCHOOL STUDENT?

1) Cost for a year's tuition is \$45.00 2) A gift of any amount for school facilities, which need to be improved.

LEAVE A LEGACY

Everyone has a gift to leave for future generations and this is called our legacy. Daily you leave a legacy of your values and your Christian faith to your family and community by how you live your life. You also may leave a financial legacy, but that takes planning. FOMM has received several legacy gifts and several informing FOMM that we will be receiving a legacy gift from them. 3. SCHOOL FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED Jesus looks up to the heavens and says, "Ephphatha, which means 'Be opened'" and heals a deaf man. (Matthew 11:5)

Children with hearing problems have received a great education at the residential school FOFMA School in

Antsirabe, Madagascar. The school has an enrollment of 200 students. Besides learning regular academic subjects, they learn how to speak with sign language. Another large part of their education is to learn a trade so they may be able to make a living.

HOW TO SUPPORT THE SCHOOL?

- 1) The cost per student is \$50.00 per month (school, room and board)
- 2) We have not begun an individual student support program because of the difficulty in having the students write letters, but we will send donors updates on the school.

4. HOPE SCHOOL "Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him." (Psalm 127:3)

A wonderful school begun by Dr. Peri and his wife Ernestine in 2007 in the capital city of Antananarivo; which provides free quality education for homeless children. These children live with extreme poverty and experience a high risk of entering the juvenile justice system or being victims of sex trafficking or child kidnaping. The enrollment of the school is 185 students in grades 1 through 9, with hopes to expand and add the high school students also. The school has an amazing national examination record of 100% of their students passing the test. The students receive a free daily lunch, which for most of them is their only meal in 24 hours.

HOW TO SUPPORT THE SCHOOL?

- 1) Teacher's salary which have been very low and the need to provide an annual improvement in their salary. Also there are additional programs that they wish to develop: vocational training, adding the high school grades and a computer lab.
- 2) You will receive reports on the progress of the school

5. MAMPIRAY (means unity) A community based support for children in publish schools that are visually impaired. (A NEW PROGRAM) "He looked up to heaven and with a deep sigh said to him, "Ephphatha!" (which means "Be opened!"). (Mark 7:34)

The Mampiray Program visits public schools to identify children with visual issues and children who have a parent in prison. Currently they are working with eight schools where they have identified 106 children and youth benefiting from the Mampiray Program: 72 of them have low vision and visual difficulties, 9 are completely blind, and 25 are children of prisoners. the program also leads teacher training programs to help the teacher know how to teach these children.

HOW TO SUPPORT THIS PROGRAM?

- 1) Cost: \$50.00 a week with provide educational materials to the public schools for using in assisting the visually impaired children to receive a quality education.
- 2) Updates on this program will be sent to donors throughout the year.

1. PRISON VOCATIONAL TRAINING (welding, sandal making, puppet making,

etc.) "Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work doing something useful with their own hands, that they may have something to share with those in need." (Ephesians 4:28)

FOMM's Prison Ministry Humanitarian Division strategy states that a vocational training program should equip a prisoner with a life skill. Upon release from prison, he or she will have an opportunity to make a living with skills learned during their imprisonment.

2. FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink..." (Matthew 25:35)

Madagascar is always listed as one of the poorest nations in the world. People are hungry and FOMM is attempting to provide food for people at Ejeda Hospital, in the 32 prisons we have a ministry, at the Toby Ambohimahazo (A Christian retreat center that cares for the poor and mentally ill) and are exploring other places to begin the distribution of food.

HOW TO SUPPORT THIS PROGRAM?

- 1) Gifts of any amount are appreciated.
- 2) An example for a gift: A gift of \$1.00 will feed a person for one day about his ministry. Please pray for him and his ministry!



3. CHURCH ROOFS "I rejoice with those who said to me, Let us go to the house of the Lord." (Psalm 122:1)

The evangelist's ministry produces amazing results (see the article on evangelists on page 2). When the number of Christians grows in a community, the first thing they want to do is build a church building. FOMM promises to pay for the installment of a metal roof on their new church building.

HOW TO SUPPORT?

- 1) The Madagascar congregation fills out an application for the cost of installing a roof.
- 2) The average cost is \$1,500 to \$2,000, depending upon local prices and size of the roof.

4. VILLAGE REDEMPTION "Beloved, I pray that in all respects you may prosper and be in good health, just as your soul prospers." (3 John 1:2)

FOMM's Board of Directors has developed a "7-Point Blueprint for Spiritual Growth and Economic Prosperity in Rural Villages in Madagascar", which may be located on www.MadagascarMission.org

A. Agriculture: The south west region of Madagascar is one of the five most likely regions in the world to experience severe drought. FOMM's goal is to make an impact in the region that may therefore draw investments from corporate and government grants to help fund FOMM's goals for agriculture development in the region.

WHAT IS NEEDED?

- (1) Establishing agricultural teaching centers to equip leaders to teach farming methods.
- (2) Create "Seed Banks" to provide and preserve seeds for the next planting season.
- (3) Plant Moringa Trees (called trees of life) which grow in arid climates. All parts of this fast growing tee provide great nutritional food values. Our goal is to plant a grove of these trees when we dig a water well.

 NOTE: We are currently in conversations with a group from Norway who are interested in working with FOMM on this project.

The Betroka Synod owns 180 hectares (445 acres) of farm land. FOMM has drilled two wells to provide water for the drip irrigation program. We now need to build two water towers to distribute the water one drip at a time to the plants so they will not dry up and as a result not produce any crops in the arid landscape. IF INTERESTED IN SUPPORTING THE BUILDING OF THE WATER TOWERS, PLEASE CONTACT FOMM. (Cost: \$7,194.00)

WHAT DOES IT COST?

- 1) Gifts of any size are welcome.
- 2) Examples: \$250.00 to build a "Seed Bank" in a village and \$2.00 for planting one Moringa Tree.

5. DRILLING WATER WELLS "I was thirsty, and you gave me drink." (Matthew 25:35)



FOMM is undertaking this program because of the arid region in southwest Madagascar. People in that region, for centuries, have had a difficult time finding water resources. Now we are able to drill through solid granite to find large pools of clean water. Please go to www.MadagascarDevelopment.org to learn more about this program.
